- Nappies, gloves, infusion sets
- Bandages, respiratory masks
- Dirty and sticky packages, e.g., milk cartons
- Small books and binders
- Transparency films, CDs and DVDs
- Packing straps and styrofoam
- Paper, wood and plastic that cannot be recycled that are not confidential
- Post-it papers, plastic sleeves
- Shoe covers, protective aprons
- Tubes
- Empty blood bags, drainage bags
- Empty catheters, probes, etc.

**NO**

- Waste that is sharp, pointed or contagious
- Biological waste
- Non-burnable objects
- No fluids
- Electrical products
- Containers with the hazard symbols below
- Glass
- Chemicals
- Light sources
- Pharmaceuticals

#### Hints and advice

Used bandages, nappies and similar objects must be placed in well-sealed packages. Non-burnable items and large objects can be sorted as bulky waste. The odd glass or ceramic item can be placed in the municipal waste container if it is well packaged.
